7	MEMBER BORRELLI: Roselle Borrelli.
8	MEMBER MCMAHON: Dennis McMahon.
9	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Jane Ratsey-Williams.
10	We have a quorum. Thank you.
11	Agenda Item No. 1, motion to accept and
12	approve the Minutes of the March 2023 regular
13	meeting. Do I have a second?
14	MEMBER BORRELLI: I'll second.
15	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: All in favor?
16	(ALL AYES).
17	All those opposed?
18	(No response).
19	Motion carried.
20	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Item No. 2, 123 Main
21	Street, discussion and possible motion on the
22	application of Anthony "Buddy" DeMarco.
23	Applicant seeks approval for a sign for a new
24	retail store called Saltwater Long Island, at the
25	end of the southwest corner of Front and Main.

- 2 SCTM No. 1001-5-4-33.1.
- 3 Is there someone here who is representing this
- 4 this evening?
- 5 Thank you, would you please step up and give
- 6 us your name and address. Thank you.
- 7 MR. DEMARCO: Joe DeMarco, 123 Main Street,
- 8 Saltwater Long Island, Greenport, New York.
- 9 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. Do you want
- to give us a general description of your business
- and why you are coming before us?
- MR. DEMARCO: Sure. We were looking to open
- up our third location for our family business. We
- create clothing, coastal clothing, from scratch. So
- from the sewing to the final product. And we have
- been here for five years and we've been coming to
- 17 the Maritime Festival for two years. We're looking
- for a place in Greenport and that entire time while
- we were trying to expand our business.
- 20 We found this location to be the best next
- 21 step for our growth.
- 22 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: It's a great location.
- MR. DEMARCO: Yes. Very exciting.
- 24 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And nice interior
- 25 space as well.

1	MR. DEMARCO: Yes.
2	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Does anyone have any
3	comments right away or are we
4	MEMBER MCMAHON: I love the sign. That's it.
5	MEMBER BORRELLI: I do, too.
6	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Me, too. In the
7	presentation you gave us, there is a third store,
8	the one with the blue on it?
9	MR. DEMARCO: Yes, that's our Huntington
10	location, it's actually located in Huntington, the
11	Walt Whitman shops in the mall. So that's one of
12	our, just, you know, example of our signage.
13	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Terrific. I don't
14	know whether it's just because of the photocopy but
15	the background on that sign, Walt Whitman, is really
16	lovely, and it looks almost like teak, or
17	MR. DEMARCO: Yes, so the wood that we use is
18	a mahogany, it's a really a nice, dense wood. So
19	that's on there. It's the same as the sign in
20	Westhampton Beach, that we use at that location.
21	It's the same sign.
22	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: So it's the same
23	background you are proposing for this?
24	MR. DEMARCO: Exactly, yes, it's the same
25	size and everything.

CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And this is just a 1 2 personal thing, but the sign is framed on the top 3 and bottom with two white mouldings, one on the window and one under the window. 4 5 MR. DEMARCO: Yes, that's just what is already structurally on the building. What is your 6 7 personal -- sorry? CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I'm wondering, should 8 9 it be centered; might you consider centering it, 10 those two, or are you going --11 MR. DEMARCO: That's my poor photoshop 12 skills. It will be centered, yes. 13 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Perfect. All right. MR. DEMARCO: It will be centered and look 14 15 pretty. 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. Roselle? MEMBER BORRELLI: I love the sign. I think 17 it's great. Very seaworthy. 18 19 MR. DEMARCO: Thank you. MEMBER BORRELLI: Lovely colors, the green and 20 21 the blue. The teak wood adds a really nice, fancy, 22 nice touch. When do you open? 23 MR. DEMARCO: I have my planning to go before 24 the public hearing next week, so hopefully that 25 Friday, if everything goes well.

CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Perfect. Thank you. 1 Dennis, any comments? 2 3 MEMBER MCMAHON: All good. 4 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Okay, I would like to note that our Commission is only voting on the work 5 6 described in your March 29th application. Any other 7 changes or new projects that you wish to make you'll have to come before the HPC. Is that clear? 8 9 MR. DEMARCO: Yes. 10 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I make a 11 motion to approve this application and issue a 12 Certificate of Appropriateness as the application is in keeping with the criteria in Greenport Village 13 Code Section 76-7. Is there a second? 14 15 MEMBER BORRELLI: Second. 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: All those in favor? 17 (ALL AYES). 18 Opposed? 19 (No response). Motion carries. Thank you. Village Hall will 20 21 contact you when your certificate is ready. MR. DEMARCO: Just to confirm, it's the two 22 23 signs. 24 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: The signs, with an

- 1 MR. DEMARCO: Thank you.
- 2 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Good catch, thank you.
- Next is Item No. 3, 171 Central Avenue.
- 4 Discussion and possible motion on the application of
- 5 Frances A. Walton. Applicant proposes to replace
- 6 seven windows on the left side of an enclosed porch
- 7 with Andersen 400 series, double-hung windows.
- 8 SCTM: 1001-5-2-8.
- 9 Is someone here to address this?
- MR. BEEBE: Yes.
- 11 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Give us your name and
- 12 address, please.
- MR. BEEBE: Tom Beebe, Sid Beebe Builders &
- 14 Sons, 2775 Main Road, Cutchoque.
- 15 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you, very much.
- Dennis, do you want to start with a talk, or
- 17 Roselle, about this application?
- 18 MEMBER BORRELLI: I'm just looking at the
- sample and it's like a one-over-one?
- 20 MR. BEEBE: It's two-over-two, storm windows
- 21 that we are replacing with an Andersen two-over-two
- 22 400 Series.
- MEMBER BORRELLI: So maybe something is
- 24 missing on the --
- 25 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: The next page. It's

- 1 this one.
- 2 MEMBER BORRELLI: Okay. Yes. That was my only
- 3 question. I thought, because on this little diagram
- 4 here it says one-over-ones and I was wondering why
- if it's two-over-twos. So it's better two-over-two.
- 6 MR. BEEBE: It's two-over-two.
- 7 MEMBER BORRELLI: Good job.
- 8 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And thanks to Dennis,
- 9 we know all about Andersen 400 windows from other
- 10 applications. Thank you, Dennis.
- I think this is very simple. I happen to
- 12 know the house, and the restorations that have been
- done there have been picture perfect. So I'm sure
- this is just going to add to that. So, thank you.
- MR. BEEBE: Thank you.
- 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: All right, I would
- 17 like to note, our Commission is only voting on the
- work described in your March 20th application. Any
- other changes or new projects that you wish to make
- you'll have to come before the HPC again. Is that
- 21 clear?
- MR. BEEBE: Clear.
- 23 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I make a
- 24 motion to approve this application and issue a
- 25 certificate of appropriateness as the application is

in keeping with the criteria in Greenport Village 1 2 Code 76-7. Is there a second? 3 MEMBER BORRELLI: I'll second. CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. All those 4 5 in favor? (ALL AYES). 6 7 All those opposed? 8 (No response). 9 Motion carries. Village Hall will contact you 10 when your Certificate of Appropriateness is ready. MR. BEEBE: Okay, thank you. 11 12 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. Item #4, 218 Main Street, Discussion and 13 possible motion on the application of 218 Main LLC 14 15 (D'latte Cafe). Applicant proposes painting the 16 front of the building dark green (Benjamin Moore Historic Collection - 135) to match the side of the 17 18 building, and the front alcove cream (Benjamin Moore 19 Historic Collection - 6). SCTM No. 1001-4-10-12. 20 Is there someone to represent? Thank you. 21 MS. PURITA: Gabriella Purita, 19995 Soundview Avenue, Southold. 22 23 Just a small note, I think you said we are painting the front to match the side. We intend to 24

leave the side the color it is right now.

- 1 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Could you speak into
- the microphone. I'm sorry.
- 3 MS. PURITA: I think you said -- sorry -- so
- 4 I think it reads that we are intending to paint the
- 5 side of the building. We are just intending to
- 6 paint the front.
- 7 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I'm sorry, to match
- 8 the side of the building, no?
- 9 MS. PURITA: No, the side of the building is
- 10 white, currently.
- 11 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I'm sorry, that is
- 12 what was provided to us.
- MS. PURITA: I'm sorry, that's wrong.
- 14 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: That's okay. I was
- 15 confused because I didn't see it green.
- MS. PURITA: No, the side of the building is
- 17 white. We intend to leave it like that because
- that's the way it is. We just wanted to paint the
- 19 front to differentiate it from 216, which --
- 20 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I love the color
- 21 choices. That green is fabulous.
- MS. PURITA: We are taking our time with the
- color.
- 24 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Are you keeping the
- 25 name "D'latte"?

MS. PURITA: I'm Frank's daughter, so we are 1 2 not changing anything. We're just changing the 3 paint to show that we are still there. CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I happen to know 4 you're Frank's daughter, but just for the record. 5 MS. PURITA: Yes. 6 7 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And we miss having D'latte around. So welcome back. 8 9 MEMBER BORRELLI: Question, Gabriella, are you 10 doing Townsend also, or just D'latte? 11 MS. PURITA: We are not involved with 216, 12 that's part of why I want to paint it. We're having a lot of --13 14 MEMBER BORRELLI: All right. 15 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: It's my understanding 16 that they are now separate buildings, and may have been purchased from different places, correct? 17 18 MS. PURITA: Correct. 19 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. Any other 20 questions? 21 (Negative response). 22 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I would 23 like to note our Commission is only voting on the work described in your April 5th application. Any 24 25 other changes or projects you wish to make, you'll

have to come before the HPC again; is that clear? 1 2 MS. PURITA: Yes. 3 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I make a motion to approve this application and issue a 4 5 Certificate of Appropriateness as the application is in keeping with the criteria in Greenport Village 6 7 Code 76-7. Is there a second? 8 MEMBER MCMAHON: Second. 9 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: All in favor? 10 (ALL AYES). 11 Opposed? 12 (No response). 13 Motion carried. Thank you. Village Hall will get a hold of you when your certificate is 14 15 ready. 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Item No. 5, 155 Stirling Street. Discussion and possible motion on 17 18 the application of Mark Moffett & Melissa Wells. 19 Applicant proposes extensive renovations to the exterior of the home, including walls, windows, 20 21 roof, doors, porches, etc. SCTM No. 1001-3-4-36.4. 22 Thank you. Is there someone to represent this? 23 MS. WELLS: Hello, my name is Melissa Wells, 24 my address is 155 Stirling Street in Greenport, and 25 I just want to thank the Historic Preservation

- 1 Commission for having us tonight. We are very
- 2 excited to share our project with you.
- This is my husband Mark Moffett, also at 155
- 4 Stirling Street in Greenport, and this evening we
- 5 also have our very talented architect and builder,
- and I'll ask them to introduce themselves and then
- 7 I'll give a brief description of the project.
- 8 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you.
- 9 MR. NICHOLSON: Hi, everyone Zach Nicholson,
- 10 licensed architect, New York state. I reside at
- 11 1250 Evergreen Drive in Cutchogue.
- MR. SCHADT: How are you doing, everyone. This
- is Kyle Schadt, North Fork Woodworks, 810 Travellers
- 14 Street, Southold. New York. Thank you, for having
- 15 us.
- 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you.
- MS. WELLS: It feels good to be here. This
- project has been a long time in coming for us.
- 19 So I just wanted a few things, before I kind
- 20 of jump into some details. It was important for me
- and for us to be really well prepared for this
- meeting, so we brought samples of everything that we
- 23 can think of for whatever you might want to look at
- and see an example of in real life.
- 25 I've also read through Minutes of previous

HPC meetings and had about ten folks, including both 1 2 of our next door neighbors, over to the house to be 3 able to see the plans, the renderings and ask questions of our architect Zach, and all of our 4 5 neighbors have expressed support of the project. CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: That is very 6 7 thoughtful. Thank you. MS. WELLS: Yes. I just want you to know that 8 9 it is important for us and that we respect our 10 neighbors and we respect this process, and so wanted 11 to do that, right, we really care about all of our 12 neighbors, especially those on either side of us. Let's see, two other things. We were granted 13 two variances on March 20th, for two non-conforming 14 15 outbuildings, so Zoning Board took care of that and 16 Mike gave us the official forms this evening. So that is now all taken care of and done. 17 18 And then a brief history of the house. 19 Interestingly enough, the house is built in 1988. It is not a historic house, although it is in the 20 historic district. 21 22 Our property was subdivided before it was 23 built from what is 165 Stirling Street, the 18th century saltbox that is next to us. 24

Our house is across the street from Stirling

Harbor and it's setback quite a bit from the street, about 120 feet. So much of the house is not visible from the street.

You may, if you've gone down Stirling Street, and there is the yacht club on one side, and you look the other side and you see trees and overgrown and things like that. That's our house, and in some ways the overgrown is appropriate.

My husband Mark is a jungle biologist and explorer, so green and overgrown, right? But it's, you know, when Mark bought the house, he bought it about 19 years ago, he moved to Greenport directly from Berkeley, California. Interestingly enough, and I'll just be brief on this bit of history, because of a clerical error, a typo that was in the New York Times. And that said Greenpoint instead of Greenport. And when he mentioned this to someone they said Greenport is fabulous, you have to go and see it. And he moved directly from Berkeley here.

And when we started, we've been together 16, 17 years, ad when we started dating it was something that he was so proud to show me; not just the Village, he introduced me to his friends, but also this cool, funny, inverted, you know, 1980s house.

So we have been thinking about doing some

work on it for quite some time. There is definitely 1 2 some maintenance that is required, but rather than 3 just do maintenance, we wanted to take the opportunity to make it better, to have better 4 materials that would be, last longer and just to 5 take a nod from the Village's maritime history, add 6 7 some curves, add some interesting elements, but 8 really improve it in a way that it will be, it will 9 last a very long time and be more beautiful. 10 So, and we are also getting rid of the write 11 vinyl 1980s windows, which I don't think anyone will 12 be unhappy with. 13 Let's see, so just a few small things and then I just want to be sure we are able to address 14 15 any of your questions. 16 So the roof lines are not changing. The roof will be architectural asphalt singles and will 17 remain a gray color, which is the same as today. 18 19 There is an existing skylight on the back side of the house, on the back roof. It's not 20 21 visible from the street. That will be replaced. 22 The exterior siding will be vertical Alaskan yellow 23 cedar. It has vertical wood siding today. The Alaskan yellow will age to a nice silver patina. 24 25 The boards will be tongue in groove, same as today.

- 1 We brought samples if you want to see sample.
- The windows will be similar in shape, most of
- 3 them, but, as I said, we are replacing the white
- 4 vinyl with aluminum clad in a stone gray color, and
- 5 basically we are taking the opportunity to just use
- 6 better materials, improve it. We will also replace
- 7 the fence, same kind, and take the opportunity to
- 8 just have improved landscaping. Just basically make
- 9 it more visually appealing and interesting.
- 10 As you know, there is a variety of
- 11 architectural styles all up and down Stirling
- 12 Street, so, yes, we are very, we are excited about
- this. So it will still have the same kind of look
- and feel and wood. Nothing on the exterior will be
- painted, but they are more of a nod to maritime.
- Our exterior lighting is from salvaged ships, and we
- have samples of that as well.
- Our upper porches, which we have today, we
- are going to connect and they'll be curved, and it
- 20 kind of reminds me of like a ship and boat
- 21 buildings.
- So, that's the high-level description of the
- 23 project. And again, please, we are happy to answer
- any questions you may have.
- 25 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I think we

- will all be interested in seeing the texture. I 1 2 think obviously it is not a historical building and 3 we are, some of us were even here when that land was separated. Dennis, you were, right? 4 5 MEMBER MCMAHON: Yes.

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- CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I think it's very kind 6 7 of nautical looking and flowing, almost like a wave. And, um, it has a nice feel, I think, for the front. 8 9 And, um, I don't think it's invasive to a property 10 that may be a little more traditional. I think that 11 was taken into consideration.
 - I have a couple of questions. And this is to the architect, I think. On the drawing, under the porch there is this cross piece here. I'm assuming it might have something to do with support but I don't see it on this side here.
- MR. NICHOLSON: So that portion of the porch 17 where it cantilevers off the house a bit more, those posts need some lateral stability, so that cross 20 member provides that structure.
- 21 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Is that flooring, the 22 horizontal line underneath?
- 23 MR. NICHOLSON: That would be a, an eight member to tie both sides. 24
- 25 MEMBER MCMAHON: A cross brace?

MR. NICHOLSON: Well, there is a metal cross 1 2 brace and then the horizontal member is more decorative. It's designed to emulate a dock 3 bulkhead, so we are using bulkhead pilings, and 4 that's the design inspiration there. 5 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Okay, I'm curious as 6 7 to what I'm calling the mesh material on the upper 8 level. If you could explain that, please. 9 MR. NICHOLSON: Sure. In the packet you'll 10 see we are exploring two different options. At the 11 time of the application we were going through 12 pricing and making sure that everything fits in the budget. What we landed on is this stainless steel 13 14 braided cable. 15 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Could you bring it 16 over? MR. NICHOLSON: Yes. The inspiration here is 17 fishing netting, so when it's spread apart, it 18 19 simulates a fishing net. So it will be mounted to stainless steel frames and stainless steel posts 20 21 that are bolted to the deck. CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I don't think this has 22 23 anything to do with us, but is this a safe, valid 24 safety --MR. NICHOLSON: Certainly. It will be very 25

- 1 taut in the frames.
- MS. WELLS: I can add, too, this material is
- 3 frequently used in public parks all over in the
- 4 United States and elsewhere, so it meets the safety
- 5 requirements.
- 6 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: It's fabulous looking.
- 7 MS. WELLS: Isn't it interesting? Zach came
- 8 up with it.
- 9 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Interesting. Thank
- 10 you.
- 11 Dennis?
- 12 MEMBER MCMAHON: No, that's fantastic. Very
- similar to some security screening we've used in the
- 14 past. That really far outweighs anything that we
- put in legally, to code, anyway. It's really over
- the top.
- 17 MEMBER BORRELLI: So that window in the front,
- 18 the one with the half window over the top, that one
- goes away and it becomes a double door; and does the
- door add on to the deck?
- MR. NICHOLSON: With the Heffron window, it
- does become windows. That's the stairwell. So we
- are going to raise it up a little bit so it's at the
- 24 height of the connecting deck.
- 25 MEMBER BORRELLI: And the down-below window

- 1 disappears.
- 2 MR. NICHOLSON: Yes. It really only brings
- 3 light to the basement landing and we didn't feel it
- 4 was --
- 5 MEMBER BORRELLI: Just one question about the
- 6 decking. You said you are using steel posts there?
- 7 MR. NICHOLSON: So they are stainless steel
- 8 posts as well as the frame to mount the stainless
- 9 steel in.
- 10 MEMBER BORRELLI: I'm just wondering, because
- it's facing the water and I'm thinking steel and --
- 12 MR. NICHOLSON: Stainless steel.
- 13 MEMBER BORRELLI: Yes.
- MR. NICHOLSON: Again, long-lasting materials.
- We want maintenance to not be an issue.
- 16 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Okay, so we'll move to
- 17 the second -- the back. Talk about an improvement,
- boy, congratulations. It doesn't even look like
- 19 the same property.
- MS. WELLS: No, it doesn't.
- 21 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Do you have a sample
- of the siding with you?
- MR. NICHOLSON: Yes, I did a mock up here.
- 24 So I'll bring this up for you.
- 25 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you.

1	MR. NICHOLSON: So we are going to be using
2	rough sawn tongue & groove cedar, as well as for the
3	window casings. The windows are stone gray, which I
4	have a sample of, if you are just looking at the
5	cutout portion of it. So the idea here is it's in
6	random widths of four, six and eight, so the seams
7	of the boards are able to align with the windows and
8	door, so you get that nice
9	CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Great attention to
10	details.
11	MR. NICHOLSON: Yes. It's a pet peeve of mine
12	when they don't align.
13	So the random pattern is emulating nature.
14	There never really are straight lines.
15	MEMBER MCMAHON: Does that follow suit with
16	everything or is that just naturally shrunk, or is
17	that the true nickel gap with spacing?
18	MR. NICHOLSON: Yeah, that's the nickel gap.
19	Potentially a board here and there might need to be
20	ripped into alignment, but, you know.
21	MEMBER MCMAHON: Yeah. Great. That's a nice
22	look.
23	MEMBER BORRELLI: I just have a question. So
24	what used to be on there was cedar?
25	MR. NICHOLSON: Yes.

MEMBER BORRELLI: And you are replacing it 1 2 with cedar? 3 MR. NICHOLSON: Yes. It's currently red cedar and we are replacing it with yellow cedar. 4 5 MEMBER BORRELLI: So it does like brown out and black out. 6 7 MR. NICHOLSON: It will silver out. 8 MS. WELLS: It's very gray today. It's not 9 like other red cedars. It's not red brown. It's 10 gray today. So it will be something similar, but 11 just a little more is silverly. 12 MEMBER BORRELLI: But it still gets sort of 13 blackish looking? 14 MEMBER MCMAHON: It can. 15 MS. WELLS: That's if it's not power washed. 16 MEMBER MCMAHON: North side, south side, east side, west side, they are all going to be different 17 18 depending on how much they'll get sun. So. It's 19 all good. MR. NICHOLSON: We are using a bit of an air 20 21 gap on the inside of the siding, which is the standard building practice today, to give the 22 23 material an opportunity to dry on both sides. 24 MEMBER MCMAHON: The ability to breath. MR. NICHOLSON: Yes, to add to the lifetime of

the material that, compared to the material that 1 2 does not have that. 3 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And because the deck is so low, it doesn't need groundings, correct? 4 5 MR. NICHOLSON: No, it currently is less than 30 inches above grade, and we are going to bring any 6 7 extra fill that we have just around the perimeter to 8 ease the transition up to the deck. 9 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Roselle? 10 MEMBER BORRELLI: I'm good. 11 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Dennis? 12 MEMBER MCMAHON: No, looks lovely. 13 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: I think your attention 14 to detail is very lovely. Thank you. 15 MEMBER MCMAHON: Yes, you make it easy. You 16 make our job easy. MS. WELLS: That was our goal. Thank you. 17 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: And Dennis especially 18 19 loves the building plans, so we are all looking at 20 the pictures. And Dennis is on it. So, all right. 21 Thank you. 22 I would like to note our Commission is only 23 voting on the work described in your April 3rd 24 application. Any other changes or new projects that

you wish to make you'll have to come back in front

of the HPC. Is that clear? 1 2 MS. WELLS: That's clear. 3 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. I'll make a 4 motion to approve this application and issue a 5 Certificate of Appropriateness as the application 6 is in keeping with the criteria in Greenport Village 7 Code section 76-7. Is there a second? MEMBER MCMAHON: Second. 8 9 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Thank you. All those in favor? 10 11 (ALL AYES). 12 Opposed? 13 (Negative response). Motion carried. Village Hall will contact 14 15 you when your Certificate of Appropriateness is 16 ready. 17 MR NICHOLSON: Thank you, so employ. 18 MS. WELLS: Thank you. 19 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: Agenda Item No. 6, motion to schedule the next Historic Preservation 20 Commission meeting for 5:00 p.m. on May 18th, 2023, 21 at the Station One firehouse. Do I have a second? 22 23 MEMBER MCMAHON: Second. 24 CHAIR RATSEY-WILLIAMS: All those in favor?
