Dear Fifth Street Resident:

As you may know, the Village of Greenport has authorized PSEG Long Island to install a new underground electric feeder cable along Fifth Street from Front Street to its southern terminus.

PSEG Long Island will also drill below the Shelter Island Sound from the southern terminus of Fifth Street to Shelter Island Heights to install a submarine cable.

As a resident along the route, we want to provide you with information on this project.

Project Specifics

PSEG Long Island will utilize horizontal directional drilling and open trenching to install new underground feeder lines from the Southold substation to Shelter Island Heights. New manholes will be installed along the route, including on Fifth Street. Once the work is complete, PSEG Long Island will repave the entire length of Fifth Street from curb to curb.

Project Route

The new underground feeder will run from the Southold substation on Main Road east to Fifth Street, south along Fifth Street, under the Shelter Island Sound via submarine conduit, and terminate in Shelter Island Heights.

What is the timeline for the project?

Construction of the submarine cable is expected to begin in late October. Set up and staging at the southern end of Fifth Street will begin the week of Oct. 9.

Installation of the new feeder on Fifth Street will begin in mid-November. All work will be complete by May 15, 2018.

What are the work hours?

Crews are scheduled to work Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Will there be any traffic interruptions?

To ensure traffic moves safely, PSEG Long Island will provide cones, flagmen and signage at the work sites, as needed. PSEG Long Island will coordinate with residents if driveways need to be blocked temporarily.

Do you have permission to do this work?

PSEG Long Island has secured all necessary permits and approvals to stage equipment at the southern terminus of Fifth Street. The New York State Office of General Services has informed PSEG Long Island

that it will issue the interim permit for drilling below the Shelter Island Sound within the next couple of days. PSEG Long Island will not begin drilling activities before the interim permit is formally received from OGS.
