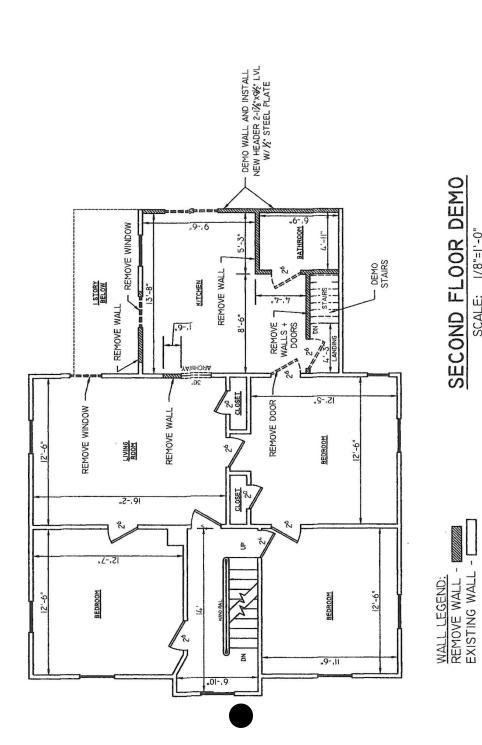
PROPOSED FOUNDATION

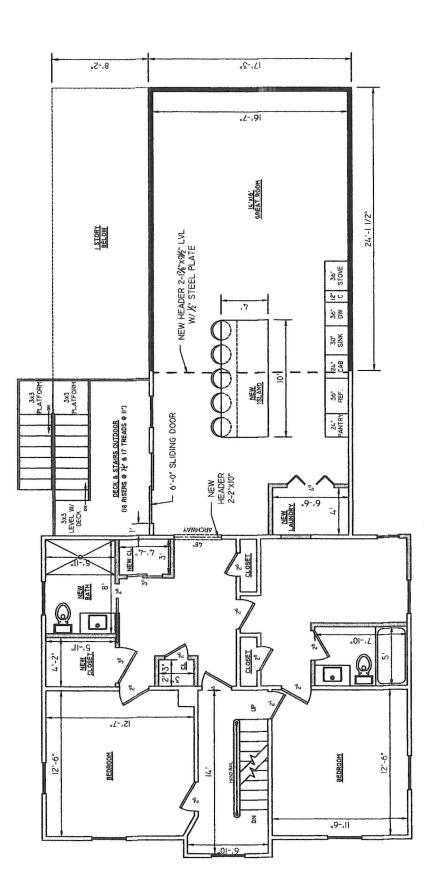
