1 Board of Trustees Meeting ~ December 2, 2024 There are four businesses 2 3 represented here in the room on 4 the Board and in the public who 5 are all potentially impacted by this. 6 7 Certainly our business is going to be potentially impacted if we 8 continue to have additional 9 10 shoaling occur, which is likely 11 over the course of this winter. 12 And from as I understand, as I 13 recall, there's a permit in place 14 that allows for dredging to occur through the end of the year. 15 it's a very short timeframe. 16 17 The last time this was dredged, 18 it was paid for, 66 percent of it was paid for by Safe Harbor. 19 other third was reimbursed to us 20 21 by the land developers at 123 22 Stirling Street. They had an 23 interest, at the time, in making 24 sure that the entrance was plenty 25 wide for navigation, but it has

1 Board of Trustees Meeting ~ December 2, 2024 become a true hazard of 2 3 navigation. I escorted a friend this summer 4 5 whose sister-in-law was on the boat who had been injured. It was 6 7 a challenge actually to stop 8 traffic. It's one-way traffic. 9 And to get them into the harbor, 10 to the hospital actually required 11 some doing. They were not familiar with the area. 12 They're from Connecticut and happened to 13 14 be in the area. But nevertheless, we were able to get to the 15 16 hospital and she was able to get 17 medical treatment. But they were 18 just in a small boat and that 19 alone was concerning enough. But I'll leave it at that. 20 21 But if there's anything at all 22 that Safe Harbor can do to help. 23 We don't want to be viewed as the 24 piggybank to do a public works
