It is like all large events, not without its challenges and not without its complications. That said, it is sad to see it take a break. They are fully expecting to be back next year. As a member of the business community and residential community, what we fear is gaps. I think we've seen that when we see something take a pause, tradition take a pause, and it is hard to regain momentum.

So one of my fears was a gap in that particular weekend in the calendar, especially for me.

Inside that world, that's -- we're really -- it's obvious to us what that means to many, many oyster growers, what it means to some of the organizations and individuals, and then what it meant as part of the business community as a busy weekend.

We expect it to come back next

year and what we certainly want to

try and do is keep the momentum

from having too big a dip. If we

could have, we would have beat the

7 announcement in the paper to avoid

8 some confusion.

So what we're -- what we got

together in the meeting the other

day was kind of a quick rapid fire

meet-up to propose a way to hold

space for their return to build

something that can integrate a

Village-wide event and to gauge

interest about opting in to such a

thing.

And, obviously, with a short
runway, we want to build as fast as
we can and we were excited to get
great feedback and see some places
where people who might have been
previously overlooked, some retail
and art establishments and even
some of the food establishments

that would like to do more or different things for an event like this. In was a lot of interest.

So we're putting together pretty quick. We are sending it out our, sort of, signups and opportunities that say what you might like to -- how you might participate, how each place might participate. Those will go out tomorrow morning. And then I'll go door-to-door to try and get as much opt-in as we can and as fast as we can.

One of the things I would love, we had a lot of interest from what I would call nontraditional nonfood and beverage locations who want to be part of the crawl who are often overlooked due to the fast-paced nature of it. We are trying to slow it down so that people spend meaningful time in the Village.

There's still no reason you couldn't run if that's what you

want to do, but I have the joy, at least, of -- I wondered into this

Village my first time, luckily, on one of the first first-night events. And if anybody had experienced that, I thought that's just how it always was here and was magical. And it turns out it's was not always like that and it doesn't always stay that way.

But one of the things that I remember being magical about it was they walked around, in addition to any other food and beverage type moments you might do. You walked around the Village activated and animated and the bookstore might have a person playing guitar.

There were certain categories and the idea was public art and music in nontraditional venues not like —— it wasn't meant to be a big concert. It was meant to draw you in out of the cold in December and

2 maybe put your face into a room 3 that you didn't always go into and 4 see it in a different light. 5 So with a lot of thought and 6 respect to Village code, that might 7 read as much as anybody, I wanted to make sure that -- and see if 8 there was a way that we could 10 declare, if I can make a request, 11 that it could be known to our 12 business community. If they would be allowed to have 13 14 some sort of music thank in their 15 establishments especially thinking 16 about the retail and art spaces 17 that aren't quite sure what the 18 rules are and how they apply to 19 them.
