1 (The meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m.)

2 MAYOR HUBBARD: All right. We're going to  
3 start the April 23rd, 2020 Regular Meeting at  
4 7:06. Pledge of Allegiance. Everybody stand and  
5 do the Pledge with me, please.

6 (All Stood for the Pledge of Allegiance)

7 MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. We're going to do a  
8 moment of silence for Alice Virginia Reiter  
9 Dzenkowski, Nancy Ellen Andrews-Kalin,  
10 Patricia Harvey, Janet Hawkins, David A. King, Sr.,  
11 Frances Helen Mims, and for all the COVID-19  
12 victims and everybody that has succumbed to this.  
13 And let's pray for all the people that are in  
14 hospitals now, that they all survive, come back  
15 to all of us, get out of the hospital and do  
16 well. Let's just pray for everybody. Just give  
17 a moment of silence, please.

18 (All Remained Standing for a Moment of Silence)

19 MAYOR HUBBARD: Thank you. We have a  
20 couple of announcements. At the request of the  
21 Memorial Day Parade organizers and the American  
22 Legion members, Supervisor Scott Russell has  
23 cancelled the Town's Memorial Day Parade, which  
24 was scheduled to take place in Mattituck on  
25 May 25th, 2020.

1           Similarly, our annual morning Memorial Day  
2 Scout service at the dock is also cancelled.  
3 That's unfortunate, but in light of the  
4 situation, we're all going to try to stay safe  
5 and keep everybody -- and we'll say our own  
6 prayers on that day for everybody that's passed  
7 away for the Memorial Day. And we're going to  
8 miss seeing the Scouts and doing our tribute on  
9 the dock, but this is what we have to do to keep  
10 everybody safe and stop the spread.

11           We have a liquor license application.  
12 There's a new liquor license application from  
13 Iberico Jamon, Inc. at 407 Main Street, with the  
14 Trade Name Basso. Anybody who wants to enter  
15 comments from the public can do so at the SLA,  
16 the State Liquor Authority. You can enter  
17 comments in. Any comments that will come from  
18 our Board, if you need to weigh in on this, if  
19 you want to, send that to Trustee Prokop (sic)  
20 and he will forward any responses from us.

21           Public Hearings: We have two Public  
22 Hearings that were postponed from last month. We  
23 have postponed both of them again this month. We  
24 hope to try to get back to our regular business  
25 in May.

1           We did have two letters today that were  
2           received for comments, a letter from Ian Wile and  
3           Deb Pittorino, which had a lot of good ideas and  
4           concepts moving forward. Also, requesting that  
5           we try to get the Boards going again and start  
6           working on different ideas. Hopefully, all the  
7           Trustees have gotten their letters, let's review  
8           them.

9           We do plan on having a work session in May,  
10          provided this all works out now, it seems like it  
11          has. So we're going to trying to implement the  
12          same procedure for Planning, Zoning and Historic.  
13          It is working. We'll see how it all transpires  
14          afterwards, but I think we're moving forward with  
15          these processes.

16          Read the letters from the two people that  
17          weighed in on this. I'm not going to read the  
18          whole thing, they were very lengthy letters, but  
19          there's a lot of good concepts and things that we  
20          could try to use to move forward to try to bring  
21          the Village back to some kind of normalcy, and  
22          help out our businesses, our community members  
23          with something to do.

24          So our work session will be on the 21st of May.  
25          We're going to start with that, we're going to go

1 with our stuff. We'll look at the schedule with  
2 the Village Attorney, with Mr. Pallas and myself  
3 to see if we want to schedule any other meetings.  
4 We'll take this, we'll talk to the Chairmen of  
5 Planning, Zoning and Historic, let them know how  
6 this worked out for us, and we're going to try to  
7 move it all forward.

8 Anybody from the public that has  
9 applications, if they want to do a deck on their  
10 house, get anything that was before one of the  
11 Boards, please get the information into Village  
12 Hall. You can do it my email. You can drop in  
13 the front door of Village Hall if you have plans  
14 or something. Get the information in, so we can  
15 start reviewing it through the Building  
16 Department, through the Attorney's Office and  
17 through the Village Administrator. And let's try  
18 to move this stuff forward, so when New York  
19 PAUSE is lifted or amended, that we can move  
20 forward and start getting applications going, and  
21 accommodate what the public needs from us and we  
22 can continue doing our job.

23 I also want to thank all our Village Staff,  
24 the First Responders, the Hospital. Everybody is  
25 doing a good job. We're trying to flatten the

1 curve, we're doing what we need to do. And I  
2 just want to thank everybody all over, you know,  
3 Village residents, everybody that's involved in  
4 this. Let's keep each other safe, let's keep  
5 moving forward. We're going to get through this  
6 all together as a good community that we are, and  
7 we're going to help each other out and we're  
8 going to move forward with this. And we're going  
9 to try to get back to normal and take care of  
10 some of our business, so that once things open  
11 up, we can just jump-start it and get everybody  
12 back to work. Okay?

13 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Mr. Mayor, I'm sorry, we  
14 had three letters, not just two.

15 MAYOR HUBBARD: Well, as of 5 o'clock, I  
16 only had two. I had not seen a third one. I  
17 don't know what time that came in.

18 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: The other one was this  
19 morning's, but, anyway, there's three letters.

20 MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. I did not see that  
21 one, so.

22 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: I wanted to make sure  
23 that everybody knew there were three, that's all.

24 MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. Is there a name on  
25 that one?

1 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Theresa Hammes (sic).

2 MAYOR HUBBARD: Okay. I had not seen that  
3 one. Okay.

4 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Okay.

5 MAYOR HUBBARD: Then there's three. I  
6 apologize for that. I had the two. I asked this  
7 afternoon if we had any others and we hadn't. I  
8 apologize for that. I probably -- I apologize to  
9 Tricia. That's fine. We'll make sure that yours  
10 is included and we'll take her comments, also.

11 TRUSTEE PHILLIPS: Okay. Thank you.

13 have any other comments before we move to the  
14 regular agenda?

Mr. Mayor and the Board of Trustees,

These are difficult times and I appreciate that each of you as individuals are working on protecting your families and jobs and businesses. I wish you all the best in those endeavours. You have my sympathy for the dual roles you must play as citizens and as a representative government in an unprecedented time.

I wanted to take this moment to press my hope and opinion that some of the vital functions of our Village Government must restart. I am specifically thinking of the duties of the various statutory boards. We must make available all of the resources and tools which our citizens can utilize to care for their properties, their businesses, begin new businesses, etc.

#### **Statutory Boards**

I believe that the processes assigned to the Planning and Zoning Boards needs to stand back up. I don't know if they have cleared their backlog due to earlier cancelled meetings from quorum calls, but just simply looking forward, the very opportunity needs to be there.

Many businesses are working day and night to reinvent themselves, to pivot into new realities- social and economic. They need to make sure that they have the facilities of government that may be required to make these steps. We have businesses who will face immovable walls in their current locations. They need the facilities of government which allow them to seek, secure, open in new locations. This is a yearly event we describe as the Greenport Shuffle- potentially magnified by current events. Any business and job retention effort will require cooperation.

#### **Accepted Use Proposal**

I have previously made the suggestions that the Mayor and Trustees resume the duties assigned to the statutory boards and make unilateral decisions, removing a highly charged environment from the shoulders of citizen volunteers. I still believe this is right. An alternative suggestion would be to state that any and all applicants seeking to do something that is code-appropriate be enabled to act without statutory board approvals. This may also accomplish a long sought after balancing of business types according to existing zoning rules. Example being that if a building in a zone is allowed to have the following uses (use 1, 2, 3) and an applicant wants to operate one of those uses- approved. Excepted uses would require inquiry, potential public meetings, etc and therefore logically be able to be pushed. Use to use, and accepted use applications would be approvable without meetings.

#### **Virtual Meetings via County Platform**

On 10 April, Sarah Lansdale, head of the Suffolk County Dept. of Economic Planning and Development let me know that they have switched to an online platform for secure meetings and document review. They have reached out to all the Towns to offer insight into the platform- both for use in interacting with County on matters before that entity, but more importantly, to discuss the opportunity for local municipalities to utilize the platform. As I have worked with Ms.

Lansdale on committees, I provided Village contact information to her, however I would encourage interested members of the Village Government to contact Sarah to explore the option. It was a point of pride for that Dept that they had not changed their ability to service the functions of the dept, despite the loss of in-person activities.

**Window Service Code**

I have previously requested that the Mayor and Board issue guidance on the long or medium term acceptance of window/curbside service. While this practice is currently being logically and sensibly allowed, it is something I believe we should be allowed to embrace for an extended time. The code calls for it to be prohibited in certain areas and I am hoping that this can be waived for 2020 to enable businesses to plan for the safety of customers and employees without fear of enforcement.

**Waste Control**

As the weather becomes nicer, has there been consideration of a change in number of trash receptacles and frequency of removal around the Village? With the population largely confined out to open spaces (and likely to remain that way even if the restrictions were lifted for personal comfort), I would expect a much higher volume of trash, especially around Mitchell Park, Glass Beach, Transportation hub, municipal parking lots, etc.

**Marinas and Boatyards**

With the Governor's unifying order allowing the re-opening of marinas and boatyards, can you let us know what the plan is for Mitchell Park marina, opening date and any changes in services, etc. Businesses and residents, many of whom are included in the current essential worker/business category can make decisions based upon the inter-twined nature of other operations and any decision regarding Mitchell Park Marina would be vital in making plans and adjusting for changes ahead.

First off, I would like to thank the Mayor, the Board and the Village administration for managing to keep the Village efficiently running during this difficult time. It is much appreciated, and I am sure has been a challenge.

Having said that, I am writing to the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Greenport today to encourage you to proactively start taking actions to support the local business community once the current NY State Pause Order and related restrictions begin to be lifted. It is imperative that we, as a Village, start to take steps now to enable our local businesses to be creative and function in what is sure to be a challenging new normal of social distancing and other related requirements. For instance, the idea has been floated on the Let's Talk Village of Greenport Facebook page, that we could consider allowing restaurants to set up stands and some seating in the Mitchell Park area or perhaps even close off Front Street to allow restaurants and businesses to expand their footprint outside. Obviously, there are challenges with this, but these are the kind of ideas we need to be thinking about. It is imperative that "nothing" be off the table right now as we think about how our local small business community will need to pivot and adapt to survive while we continue to be challenged by COVID 19.

I would like to encourage the Board to hold weekly meetings for the foreseeable future and to identify a mechanism by which public comments can be made so that the Board is in the position (to the extent necessary) to approve any changes to the Village Code or other approvals that may be necessitated to support our local businesses (including any statutory Board meeting approvals (I note that I am a member of the Planning Board but am addressing the Board in my personal capacity at this time). There are a lot of great ideas in the Community and it would be great if the Board could have a "public" virtual meeting to solicit input from the Greenport Village BID as well as the local community on things that we could do to support our local businesses as the restrictions are lifted. It would also ask that the Village endeavor to make any proposed agenda for a Village Board meeting available at least 36 (or ideally 48) hours before the actual meeting so that the public has the opportunity to submit timely and thoughtful comments. As of 9:15 AM on April 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Agenda for the April 23<sup>rd</sup> Board meeting was still not available on the Village website even though comments were requested by 4:30 PM on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Thank you for your consideration of these thoughts and thank you again for leading our Village during these challenging times.
